Q: When should I give up on a plant?

A: Nicole Jagusztyn, VISTA's Education Chair, says, "Sometimes it is better to remove a sick, damaged, or struggling plant so you can make space for a new one. If it's sick, pull it gently out of the ground and try to leave as much soil as possible. If it's damaged beyond repair, cut the stalk at the ground level and leave the roots to decompose in your soil."

I think connecting to nature and to all of the arts is so important for all people, but especially children.
